

The American Heritage Library and Museum has been open to the public since 1893. Originally designated the "*Repository of the Southwest*" for the collection and preservation the rolls, records and other documents relating to our nation's early history, it is, to the Sons of the Revolution, a living, working memorial to those patriotic Americans who fought and died for the freedoms we enjoy today. The Sons have pledged themselves to keep their story alive on these shelves as long as their finances permit.

The "Friends of the Library and Museum" was reformed in 2002 as an association of such persons who may not otherwise be eligible for membership in the Sons of the Revolution who wish to assist in this patriotic endeavor.

Purpose

The purpose of the "Friends of the Library and Museum" is to increase and encourage the appreciation of America's Heritage, further promoting the purpose and objectives of the Sons of the Revolution in the State of California, by assisting the Sons of the Revolution in: (a) fundraising efforts; (b) providing volunteer services; (c) support services for both the library and museum; (d) assisting in its collection and preservation of objects of historic interest and importance, including literary and artistic materials, such as books, rolls, records, documents, works of art, and other such historical artifacts relating to that history; and (e) to support the furtherance of historical research and publication of that history for benefit of the general public. Like the operations of the American Heritage Library and Museum, the Friends of the Library and Museum is divided into two distinct areas of support - library and museum.
