"It's A Wonderful Life" for Fellow Member!!!

The Board of Directors takes great pleasure in announcing that Brigadier General James Maitland Stewart, U.S. Air Force, (Ret.) has become a life member of the Sons of the Revolution in the State of California. He is better known to millions of fans as the Academy Award winning film actor "Jimmy Stewart". Mr. Stewart holds state membership number 3215-L and joins the Sons based upon his descent as a third great-grandson of Pvt. Fergus Moorhead who served in the Pennsylvania militia during the Revolutionary War.

For more than fifty years, moviegoers have singled him out as being the most trusted and admired Hollywood superstar. Mr. Stewart devoted fans have always pointed to his inspiring quality of decency. His movies, often re-release and shown on television, still draw millions of viewers. Dwight Eisenhower once remarked: "Jimmy Stewart is among the greatest Americans," and Ronald Reagan said: "I often wished I were just like him."

Aside from his film career, Mr. Stewart served his country with distinction during World War II as a U.S. Army Air Corps bomber pilot in numerous combat missions over Nazi Germany. He participated in the spectacular raids on Bremen in December of 1943 and over Berlin in 1944. For his leadership of the 703rd Squadron of bombers during the February 20, 1944 raid on aircraft factories at Brunswick, he was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross. By the end of the war, he rose to become Chief of Staff of the 2nd Combat Wing of the Eighth Air Force with the rank of Colonel. Following the war, he remained active with the U.S. Air Force Reserve and achieved the rank of Brigadier General before retiring from the service. Mr. Stewart is also the recipient of the Distinguished Service Medal and the Presidential Medal of Freedom, our nation's highest civilian honor.

Congratulations to our society's First Vice President, The Hon. William W. Huss, 1r., and Timothy W. Rodman, Curator of the Sons of the Revolution Library, who have been admitted to the very prestigious Aztec Club of 1847. Mark James Denger, Archivist of the Sons of the Revolution Library, who was honored with the President's Commendation Award at our society's last held Independence Day Luncheon, has been commissioned as a Kentucky Colonel by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. On May 15, 1995, The Hon. Raymond L. Drake was installed as Governor General of the Ancient and Honourable Order of the Jersey Blues which was founded on 1673 by his ancestor, Capt. Francis Drake of Piscataway. Ray is also affiliated with the Swedish Colonial Society and the Netherlands Society of Philadelphia. With the recent admission of **Richard H. Breithaupt**, **Sr.**, to membership, our Society's President, Richard H. Breithaupt, Jr., now joins the ranks of our "second generation" members. In addition to his active affiliation with our Society, President Breithaupt has been inducted into the National Society of Americans of Royal Descent as well as the Saint Andrew's Society of the State of New York, this latter group having been founded in 1756. Fellow member Edward P. Ash, who was admitted to membership last year while still a Cadet at the United States Military Academy at West Point, has been commissioned and is now proudly serving our country as a Second Lieutenant on active duty with the U.S. Army. **President Emeritus Lee E. Bishop**, **]r.**, continues to serve as Governor of the Southern California Branch of the National Society Sons and Daughters of the Pilgrims. Congratulations to Fritz Hutcheson and his brother, The Rev. Virgil M. Hutcheson. Fritz turns 80 in October and Virgil turns 71 in November. Three generations of their family are now on our membership rolls, all representing their ancestor, Pvt. Jacob Buzbee, who honorably served in the South Carolina cavalry during the Revolutionary War under the "Swamp Fox", Gen. Francis Marion.

Jimmy Stewart's film career speaks for itself. He has provided the American public with memorable performances in such films as "Mr. Smith Goes to Washington" (1939), "It's a Wonderful Life" (1946), "Winchester '73" (1950), "Broken Arrow" (1950), "Harvey" (1951), "The Naked Spur" (1953), "The Glenn Miller Story" (1954), "Rear Window" (1954), "The Far Country" (1955), "The Spirit of St. Louis" (1957), "Vertigo" (1958), "Anatomy of a Murder" (1959), "The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance" (1962), "Shenandoah" (1965), and "The Shootist" (1976). He won the Academy Award for Best Actor in 1941 for his performance in "The Philadelphia Story" (1940), and he won a Special Academy Award in 1984 for "his 50 years of meaningful performances, for his high ideals, both on and off screen, with the respect and affection of his colleagues."

Mr. Stewart was directed in his classic motion picture "It's A Wonderful World" by fellow SR member, the late Woodbridge S. Van Dyke in 1939. He starred in "The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance", written by State Society First Vice President, the late James Warner Bellah.
