

MEMBERS IN THE NEWS

- Congratulations are extended to President Emeritus Richard H. Breithaupt, Jr., who was re-elected on October 11, 1997, as national President of The Aztec Club of 1847, when that Society held its special Sesquicentennial Meeting in Mexico City in the very rooms in the historic building where the Club was founded 150 years ago. Rick was also elected President of the California Association of the Society of the Cincinnati at its Annual Business Meeting on Nov 1, 1997, at the St. Francis Yacht Club in San Francisco.
- A salute also goes to long-time member The Hon. Raymond L. Drake who
 retired on January 1, 1998, as the Presiding Municipal Court Judge for
 Cripple Creek, Colorado. Ray is presently serving as Deputy Governor
 General for the Society of Colonial Wars in the State of Colorado and he also
 holds an affiliation with The State Society of the Cincinnati of Pennsylvania.
- The Rev. Dr. Gary Alan Dickey, a member of the Society since 1991, recently completed his second doctorate, a Ph.D. in Administration, at Trinity Theological Seminary. Rev. Dickey is Pastor of the First United Methodist Church of Canoga Park and was re-elected this year as President of the Society of the War of 1812 in the State of California.
- Dr. Charles B. Witt, Jr., was elected to the Board of Directors of the Society at the Annual Membership Meeting held on January 17, 1998. He has been affiliated with the Society since 1966. Dr. Witt, a prominent thoracic surgeon in Los Angeles, served as President General of the National Society of Washington Family Descendants from 1982 to 1984. Dr. Witt is a second cousin, six times removed, to George Washington, and a direct descendant of George Washington's great-grandfather, Col. John Washington of Virginia.
- Former Society Vice President Lytle Harrison, Jr. also has some illustrious Virginia roots. Lytle's great-uncle was Benjamin Harrison, 23rd President of the U.S. His great-great-grandfather was William Henry Harrison, 9th President of the U.S. And, his great-great-great-grandfather was Benjamin Harrison, V, of" Berkeley," a Signer of the Declaration of Independence and a Governor of Virginia.
- Alexander R. Early, III and James C. McHargue were elected President and Secretary, respectively, of the Southern California Chapter of the California Association of the Society of the Cincinnati at its George Washington Commemorative Dinner held at the California Club on February 29, 1998 in Los Angeles.
- An additional salute goes to members Steven M. Denger and Daniel R. Justice. Steven Denger, a high school junior, was recently promoted to First Lieutenant within his JROTC unit. His father is Mark J. Denger, a Vice President of the Society. Daniel Justice, a high school freshman, is also now enrolled in JROTC and has expressed interest in going on to serve in the Navy. His grandfather, Lieutenant Commander Richard R. Justice, USN, Ret., was a member of the Society.
