

Society Represented at Lincoln Memorial

On February 12, 1996, Society President Richard Breithaupt, Jr., First Vice President William W. Huss, Jr., and The Hon. Raymond L. Drake were in Washington, D. C. representing the Aztec Club of 1847 at the Lincoln Memorial during the ceremony commemorating the 187th anniversary of the birth of the sixteenth President of the United States. The traditional wreath laying commenced at 11:45 a.m. with prelude music by the U. S. Army Band. Following the presentation of colors and invocation, wreaths were placed for the President of the United States, the Diplomatic Corps and various hereditary and patriotic societies.

The Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States, traditional organizer of the celebration, presented its Literary Awards. The previous Saturday evening, February 10, a black tie reception and dinner was held at the Officer's Club at Fort Myer, Arlington, Virginia. The featured speaker was an interpretive historian for Ford's Theater, site of Lincoln's assassination. Mr. Breithaupt serves as national President of the Aztec Club of 1847 while Messrs. Huss and Drake and members of the Club's Executive Committee. The Aztec Club of 1847 is composed of members descended from those American officers serving in the Mexican War (1846-1848).



His Own Grandfather

"Wm. Harmen, a resident of Titusville, Pa., is reported to have committed suicide a few days ago as the result of a melancholy conviction that he was his own grandfather. He left the following singular letter: I married a widow who had a grown-up daughter. My father visited our house very often, fell in love with my step-daughter and married her. So my father became my son-in-law, and my step-daughter my mother, because she was my father's wife. Sometime afterward my wife had a son. He was my father's brother-in-law and my uncle for he was the brother of my step-mother. My father's wife, i.e., my step-daughter, had a son. He was, of course, my brother and in the meantime my grandchild for he was the son of my daughter. My wife was my grandmother, because she was my mother's mother. I was my wife's husband and grandchild at the same time and as the husband of a person's grandmother is his grandfather, I am my own grandfather."

The General Society has available for purchase a handsome membership certificate suitable for framing, measuring approximately 16" x 24". Individually engrossed with the member's name, ancestor's name and Revolutionary War service, the certificate is printed on high quality stock and includes fine decorative artwork along with the seals of the original thirteen colonies. Each certificate bears the personal signatures of the General President, General Secretary, State President and others.

The procedure for ordering a certificate is to request from Mr. Charles B. Miller, Society Secretary, an Order Form. The completed form is returned to him along with a check payable to the General Society in the amount of \$50.00. Due to the fact that each certificate is hand prepared and bears signatures of the key officers, members should expect some lag time between the time of order and delivery.
